

**Program Report: JENESYS2019 Inbound Program for ASEAN Youths  
(18<sup>th</sup> Batch)**

**(Country: Indonesia, Theme: Peace Building)**

## **1. Overview of the Program**

As part of JENESYS2019, 24 Indonesian, who are engaged in Islamic Association and university students, visited Japan for eight days from January 21st to 28<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Under the theme of "Peace Building", they have participated in each program. In Tokyo, They visited Masjid-Indonesia (Mosque), and have had a lecture on the theme at Japan Halal Business Association, Takushoku University, and Sharia Research Institute. In Hiroshima, they have interacted with students at Hiroshima University during school exchange program. Both of them, they have actively exchanged their opinions and built up their friendly relationship. Furthermore, they visited Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park and Peace Memorial Museum and have deepened their consideration that it is important for people in the world and posterity to let them understand the reality of the atomic bomb victims. During this program, they also posted their concerns and experiences in Japan on SNS. They presented a plan for the action to take after returning to Indonesia with making use of their experience in Japan visiting, at the reporting session before their leaving Japan.

◆ Student

As a history lover, I enjoyed my visit to the Tokyo Edo Museum very much. I could have been only learning from history books and comic books though, I was able to see and imagine old Japan. At the Hiroshima Memorial Museum, I felt that all the things about the atomic bombing in Hiroshima which had to be recorded for peace education to the next generation, although it was a heavy theme. What impressed me the most was that Japanese people put their hearts on the trees. Usually, only human beings are recognized as victims in Indonesia. However, in Japan, trees are also recognized as victims. I was also allowed to meet with atomic bomb victims in Hiroshima and it was truly moving experience, which was indescribable, for me. I hope that they will continue this event to build peace.

Everything in Hiroshima is amazing. My home-stay parents treated us like real children for them and they were really nice people. I felt their great hospitality. The university, NGO, Hiroshima Memorial Park, and all the places, where I visited, were really good. I was able to learn about Japanese culture and customs. 

